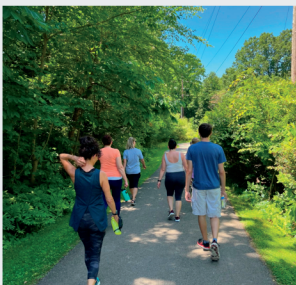

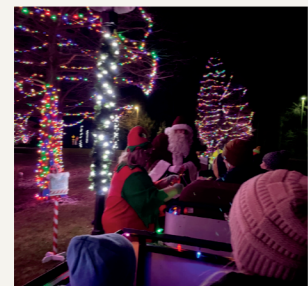

PARKS MASTER PLAN

In the last year, City leaders in Stow have taken huge steps to improve the community's parks, recreation facilities, programs, and events. As part of that progress, the City of Stow undertook a Parks and Recreation Master Plan project. The project will provide a guide for Stow's Parks and Recreation system for the next ten years.

The year-long process included a community engagement component which involved gathering input from members of the community through a statistically valid survey, an online community survey, interviews with community stakeholders, and focus group meetings. Existing parks and recreation users would like to see the city leaders make a more substantial investment in the system by making even more improvements and upgrades to existing parks, adding new community-based facilities that serve the entire community, and developing programs that connect with the community. The Master Plan establishes a framework and roadmap for the City of Stow to follow for future success:

- It outlines the groundwork needed to transform the system to a proactive state that will connect residents to many positive experiences, and make Stow a community of choice to live, work and play in.
- It offers a vision for the parks and recreation system that can energize the community to want to invest in and use their parks, trails, and programs more as part of their daily lives.
- It provides an action plan to address obstacles to progress, with an overall goal of meeting and surpassing the community's expectations for its park system.

Obstacles addressed in this master plan include:

- Low operational and capital funding compared to similar-sized cities. This affects staffing, equipment, and productivity.
- Lack of indoor community spaces that support programs that serve the whole community.
- Lack of facilities to provide year-round programming and self-directed activities such as walking/biking trails, game fields for all types of sports, and indoor and outdoor play spaces.
- Staffing limitations to care for and maintain the park system so that it is a source of pride for residents.
- Providing more programming for people of all ages and abilities that will create lifetime experiences.

The aim of this master plan is to solve these systemic problems, break down barriers and build bridges in their place. The Master Plan identifies key goals and recommendations that address these elements to move the City forward:

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

1. Develop a multigenerational community center.
2. Build staff capacity to meet the operational and maintenance needs of the citizens of Stow.
3. Expand quality programs and events to connect more residents to the services provided.
4. Maintain and upgrade existing parks, amenities, and spaces.
5. Develop sustainable funding strategies and sources.
6. Develop a connected trail system throughout the city.
7. Develop the Hanson Property across the street from the Fox Den Golf Course for a new Community Park.

NEXT STEPS

As part of that master planning process, almost 1,700 residents completed a community survey. In that survey, respondents were asked to prioritize their top four recreational amenities for their households. The amenity receiving the strongest support was a community center/recreation center.

As a result of this master plan and its public input process, the City has engaged a consulting team to complete a feasibility study for a multi-purpose, multi-generational indoor facility. At this time, the City is only committed to the completion of the feasibility study. The feasibility study will provide the City with key data and information on the market and demand for services, develop operational costs, and determine capital investment for potential construction.

CONCLUSION

The Parks and Recreation Master Plan provides City Leaders with the roadmap and tools it needs to enhance the parks, facilities, programs, and events for the next ten years and beyond. The department staff, the Mayor, City Council and the Parks and Recreation Board are more than ready to begin the implementation process to move the parks and recreation system forward.

STOW CITY CENTER COMPLEX

The City of Stow is hard at work on its City Center Project, a development plan that will create a community gathering space on the site of the former SKIP Playground and adjacent property. This first project in the City Center development will focus on the rebuild of SKiP Playground, creating an abundance of fun and easily accessible opportunities for families and children. Groundbreaking took place Spring 2022, with parks maintenance making many site improvements. The installation of playground components, ordered earlier in 2022, is expected in the Spring of 2023.

This community amenity will serve as an anchor project for a comprehensive, long-term plan to develop a focal center for the City of Stow, successfully combining culture, recreation, leisure, education, wellness, inclusion, and more. Importantly, this project will engage residents and visitors alike.



COMMUNITY INPUT

The City of Stow conducted a Visioning Workshop in 2019 that helped create a plan for the space. The workshop included members of the Parks and Recreation Board, Arts Commission, Commission on Inclusion, and Senior Citizens Commission. At the conclusion of the workshop, approximately 20 residents agreed to volunteer on ad hoc committees. The Playground Committee and the Steering (Fundraising) Committee were formed. Prior to COVID, the committees were meeting regularly to discuss their areas of focus. Both committees submitted recommendations to the administration.

These recommendations helped shape the project as it developed. They concluded with the mission of the project: *“To create a welcoming, safe outdoor gathering space custom-tailored by the community for the community that encourages interactive, healthy play and independence for people of all ages and abilities.”*

Mayor John Pribonic and the Parks and Recreation Department hosted two receptions to thank volunteers who helped on the committees for the Stow City Center Project, including the new SKiP playground coming Spring 2023. We appreciate the time volunteers gave to help with the project from conception to design to implementation. We are excited that the first steps of the project are underway with the upcoming installation of the new SKiP playground. The attendees were able to see the SKiP concept video and view pictures and descriptions of all the pieces of equipment that will be installed.





EXPLORE

Stow's Beautiful Parks

Residents of Stow are blessed with an abundance of beautiful parks to enjoy throughout the year. The 410 acres of parkland include 6 neighborhood parks and 4 community parks with amenities. Be sure to get out and enjoy all the parks we have to offer!

Adell Durbin Park **3300 Darrow Road**

This 34-acre park, located on the border of Stow and Munroe Falls contains a large play area and playground, lavish hiking trails, a wildflower meadow and lit tennis/pickleball courts.

Crestdale Neighborhood Park **4570 Timberdale Drive**

The 7.5 acres of land is primarily covered by forest which incorporate several hike and bike trails that lead to area neighborhoods. A small collection of play equipment serves the youngsters of the area. A small parking area is provided for visitors.

Heather Hills Neighborhood Park **1641 Bobwhite Trail**

This park, nestled in the northeast portion of the Heather Hills development off of Bob White Trail, is an all-wooded area containing 6.4 acres. The site contains play equipment and a walking trail.

Meadowbrook Lake Neighborhood Park, **5069 Hudson Drive**

This park contains a 19-acre lake located in the Meadowbrook Lake allotment in the Northwestern part of the City. The lake is available for use by the public with public access off of Hudson Drive, or a small park on Mac Drive and Meadowbrook Blvd. The lake is surrounded by private residences, but fishing is permitted off the public access areas. Swimming by the public is strictly forbidden. There is also a play area, picnic area and newly renovated basketball courts.





**Northport Neighborhood Park
3780 N. Santom**

An open play field is maintained for pick-up team sports, volleyball, kite flying, or summer activities. Picnic tables are available with the new modular play equipment updated Summer 2022. The park site is 2.5 acres on Charring Cross Dr.

**Oregon Trails Park
2913 Graham Road**

This park has a variety of facilities which include, baseball fields, soccer fields, a meeting room, concession stand, restrooms and an adjacent playground, KidStation Playground, and Safety Village.

**Partridge Highlands Neighborhood Park
3020 Stockbridge Drive**

This neighborhood park is located in the Partridge Highlands development off Fishcreek Road. Two sites, one located north (10 acres) and one south (4 acres) off of Wexford Blvd., provide open play areas and hiking

**Sancturetum at Stow City Center
3760 Darrow Rd.**

This wooded area behind the Stow City Center includes the Cleveland Clinic Akron General Wellness Trail, a .75 mile loop that connects to local neighborhoods.

**Sherwood Acres Neighborhood Park
4344 Forest Hill Road**

A 1.25 acre park site is located at the corner of Dresher Trail and Forest Hill in the Sherwood Acres Development. The site has an open play area with the new play equipment updated Summer 2022.



**Silver Springs Park
5027 Stow Road**

This large 280 acre park houses the Leona Farris Lodge (5027 Stow Road) and Heritage Barn (5238 Young Road) which are available for event rental. Rental information is available on our website.

The park is well-known for the S.O.A.R. Boundless Playground for children of all abilities. When visiting the park, you will also find Bow Wow Beach (the city's dog park), baseball and softball fields, outdoor shelters available for rent, and vast hiking and cross-country trails.

Nestled in Silver Springs Park is Silver Springs Campground, owned by the City of Stow, and operated by the Parks and Recreation Dept. since 1976. The City has been providing outdoor recreational opportunities at this site for over four decades, and the public has really taken advantage of it.

**SKiP Playground
3870 Darrow Road**

Creating an abundance of fun and easily accessible opportunities for families and children. Groundbreaking took place in Spring 2022, with the installation of playground components in Spring 2023.

**Wetmore Neighborhood Park
3135 Kent Road**

This 5 acre park is a beautiful shaded tree-covered parcel located on Park Drive off of State Route 59 (Kent Road). The park is ideal for walking, resting, or open play for youngsters. It primarily serves the neighborhood residents in the southwest section of the City.



STOW SENIOR CENTER



For the past few years, the Stow Senior Center has been a place of comfort and familiarity during the most uncertain times of our lives. Throughout the pandemic, we offered creative, fulfilling and safe programming alternatives for senior citizens to participate in through drive-thru, virtual, and limited attendance activities. The Stow Senior Center strived to bring back all the pre-pandemic activities it once offered in its normal capacity for 2022.

With a reach of over 500 seniors from Stow and surrounding communities, we understand the need for recreational and social opportunities for the older generation. We are excited to report, all weekly programs offered by the Stow Parks and Recreation Department are at capacity. These programs include bingo, dominoes, cards, Mah Jongg, and bus trips. We will continue to meet the needs of seniors through creative programming, special events, and presentations.

SIVERSPRINGS CAMPGROUND

Silver Springs Campground, 5238 Young Road, Stow is owned by the City of Stow, and operated by the Parks and Recreation Department since 1976. Nestled in Silver Springs Park in the Northeast corner of Stow, it is one of only a few municipally-operated campgrounds in Ohio.

Campers have access to many amenities throughout Silver Springs Park while camping, including fishing at Heritage Lake, hiking on the trails in the woods, tot lot fun at SOAR playground, dog exercise at Bow Wow Beach, active recreation at the tennis and basketball courts, and throw-together games and activities in the many open fields. The campground is also adjacent to the Metro Parks' Bike and Hike Trail. The facility has 27 campsites, some open, and some shaded.

Site amenities include picnic tables, fire rings, adjustable grills, and electric hook-ups (20 & 30 AMP). Water spigots are scattered around the campground. A trailer dump station is available for mobile units. Portable restrooms are on site, flush restrooms are nearby at our ball field complex.

BOW WOW BEACH



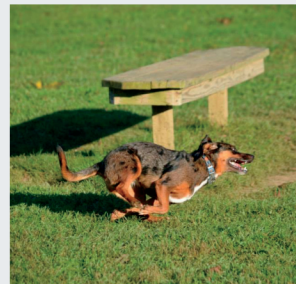
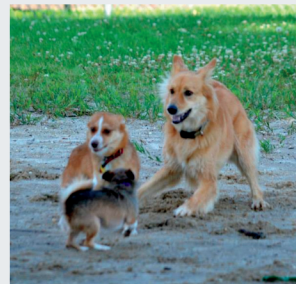
Stow's dog park officially opened in June 2007, and has been well received by residents of Stow and the surrounding area. The park is owned by the City of Stow and managed by the Parks and Recreation Department.

The park is not staffed during open hours. It is incumbent upon park users to follow the clearly defined rules.

Bow Wow Beach is open every day, mid-March - December 1, from 8 am until Sunset, weather dependent. Scheduled maintenance is every Thursday morning.

The 7.5 acre fenced-in park features the following amenities:

- Sandy beach and grassy knolls
- 3-acre lake
- Pen entrances
- Waste deposit stations
- Dog washing stations
- Separate areas for small dogs
- Clearly defined rules and procedures



STOW COMMUNITY GARDEN



Stow Community Garden is located at 5027 Stow Road. Plot registration began in March with planting after Memorial Day. 20' x 20' plots are available for \$20 and were sold out for the 2022 season.

Gardeners are asked to donate their extra produce to sell at the Stow Community Farmers Market on Saturdays throughout the season to help raise funds for expenses for the Community Gardens, including tilling of the soil before planting.

PICKLEBALL

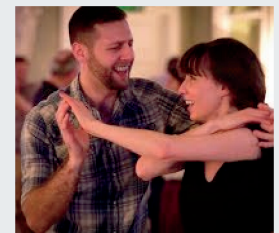

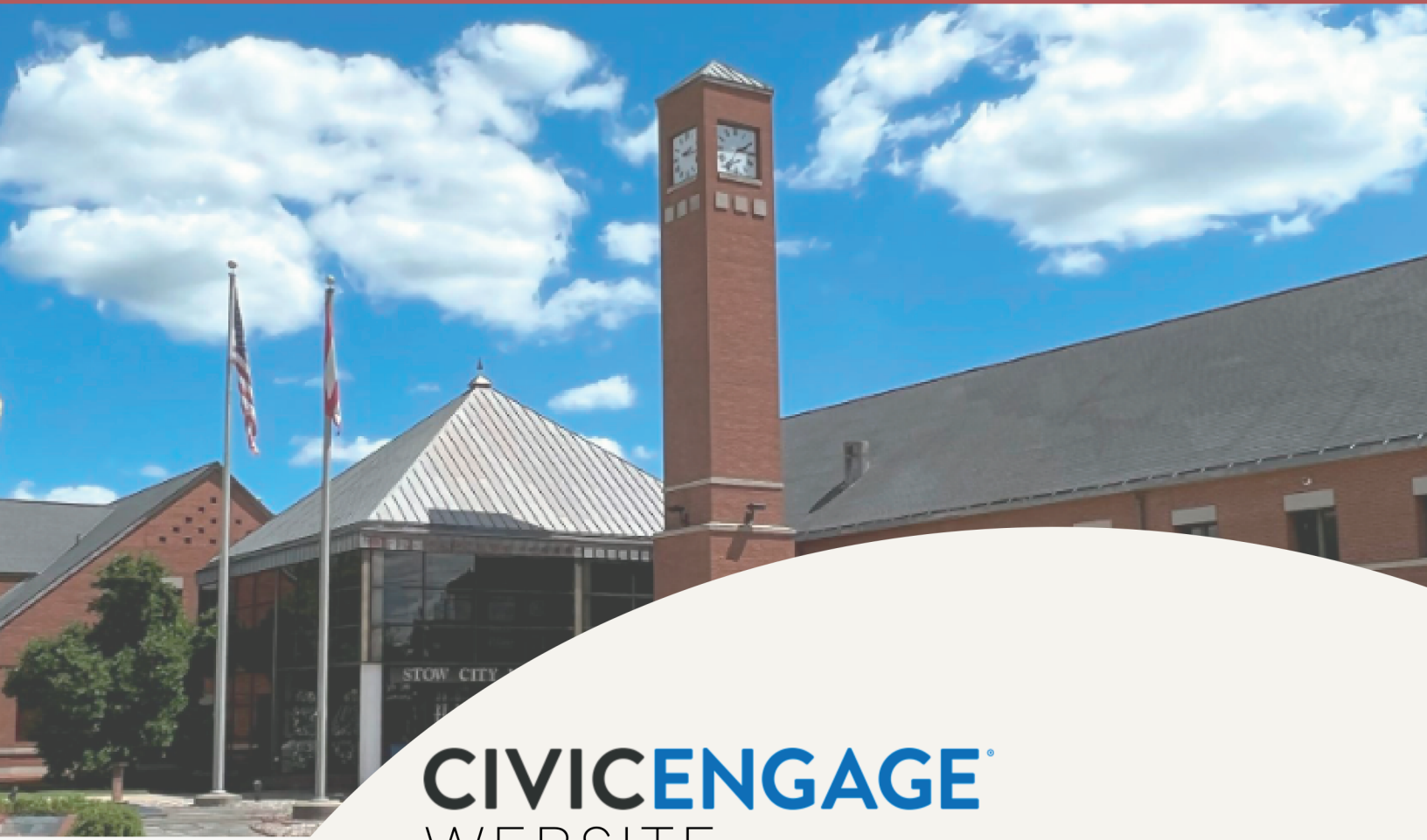

EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The City of Stow launched the CivicReady Emergency Alert Notification system in October. This replaced the Summit County Reverse Alert as our means of communicating emergency information with our residents. The CivicReady mass notification solution is a communication service available to our citizens to receive emergency. Communication can be received through email, text and/or phone call according to your selections and based on address locations that you specify. The information you provide is confidential and will not be shared.

The CivicReady solution also integrates with the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Integrated Public Alert Warning System (IPAWS). The IPAWS system leverages national emergency communication channels, such as the Emergency Alert System (EAS), NOAA weather radios, digital road signage, and television broadcasts, to provide area-specific alerts in times of emergency. By integrating its CivicReady system with IPAWS, Stow will be able to reach as many people as possible during an emergency event, including those who have not opted-in to text, phone, or email communications, as well as travelers and visitors in the area.

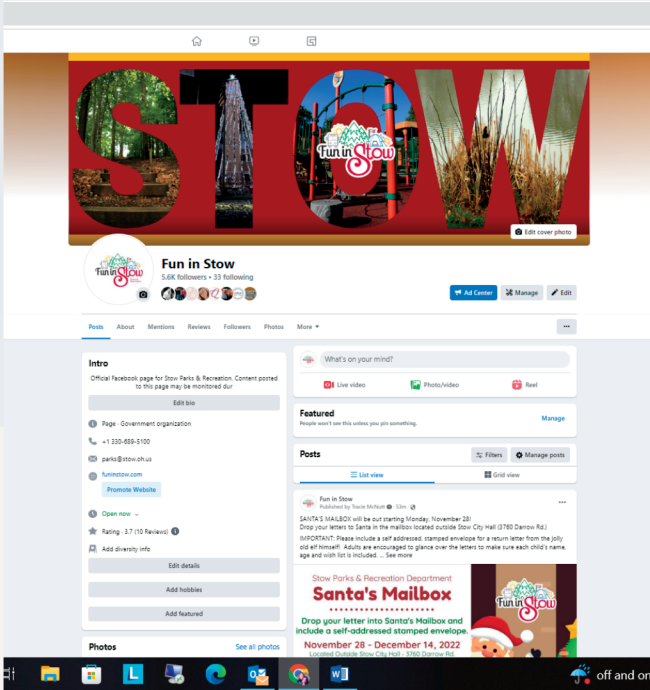

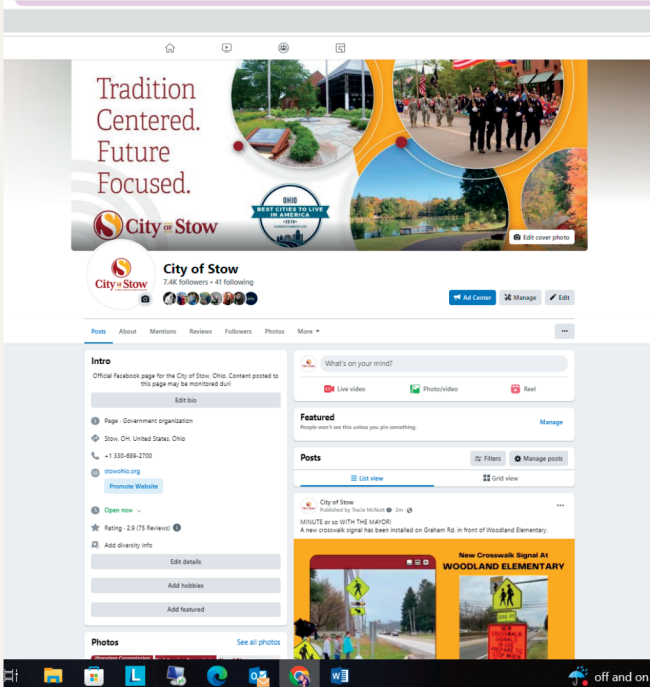

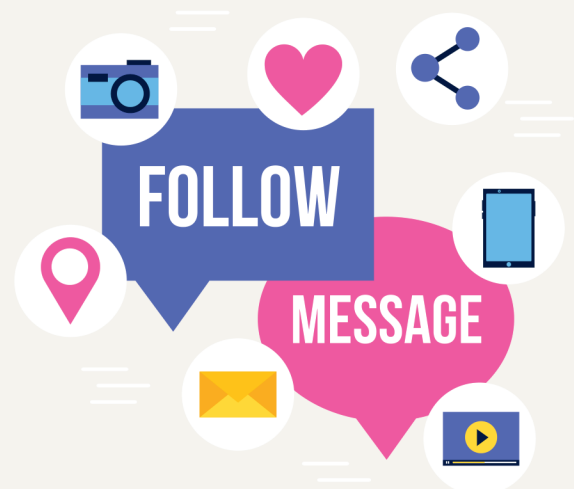
