WHEREAS, As our trees once again begin blooming and flowering, please remember Arbor Day is Friday, April 28th, 2023; and,

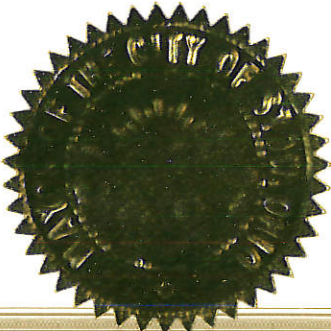
WHEREAS, In 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for planting of trees and Arbor Day was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska and is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and,

WHEREAS, Trees and urban forest are an important component of our community's infrastructure. Trees reduce topsoil erosion caused by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife. Trees and urban forest also extend the life of our community's streets and reduce storm water runoff; and,


WHEREAS, Trees and urban forest help to reduce water pollution and the need to treat an integral part of our community's healthy water supply and also may improve the concentration of school age children allowing them to perform at a higher level in school and make better life choices; and,
